

ROUNDERS are tunes that can be played as a round. Each part is harmony/counterpoint to the other part(s) but they can also be played as a fiddle tune with the parts in sequence.







Rounders



These tunes can be played as simple two or three part fiddle tunes. However, each part is designed to be counterpoint to the other part(s).

The basic arrangement is for two players, starting in unision. In the second pass one player skips half of the A part. Then in the B part that player returns to playing standard AABB repeats, creating alternating phrases of melody and counterpoint.

The tune titles for 1-6 are derived from 1920s-ish Mississippi accounts or late 1800s / early 1900s era slang or euphemisms.



Prairie Queen


(Dedicated to Trcia Spencer, the queen of Kansas fiddling!)


While playing this tune in Kansas with Tricia Spencer, I realized that I must dedicate it to her, since she is the "Prairie Queen" of Kansas fiddling.
